

**DECLARATION OF ROBERT R. OVROM**

I, Robert R. Ovrom, declare:

1. I have personal and first hand knowledge of the facts set forth below and, if called and sworn as a witness, I could and would competently testify as to each of them.

2. I have worked as the City Manager for the City of Burbank for nearly 15 years.

3. My office is located on the second floor of City Hall. Visitors generally visit me with an appointment, but may see me without an appointment if I am available.

4. Visitors who come into my office either with or without an appointment check in with my secretary before they are invited in to my office.

5. On a morning in December, 1999, I was walking in to City Hall and as I walked across the rotunda on the first floor I saw a man who greeted me. I did not recognize the man but I responded back. I later learned that the man was Mr. Al Beardsley

6. As I walked up to the stairs to my office the man followed me.

7. As I turned left into my office, the man turned right into the City Council Office.

8. I went into my personal office and stood behind my desk.

9. As I looked up I saw the man walk past my secretary's desk and into my personal office. My secretary asked if she could help him but he didn't respond and walked past her.

10. He came into my office, closed the door and sat down on the chair nearest the door.

11. I looked at the lock on the door and could see that it had locked automatically.

12. Mr. Beardsley didn't say anything and seemed to have a glazed

2 13. I walked over to the door and opened it and said, "We don't close  
3 doors here."

4 14. I then walked out the door and closed it behind me.

5 15. I told the secretaries in the office to call the police and then to  
6 leave the office and go to the other side of the building.


7 16. Within a few minutes Burbank Police Lieutenant Don Brown,  
8 arrived in plain clothes followed in a minute or two by two other plain clothes
